The Oberton by Cosmoscow graphic art fair will be held on December 5-7 at the new TON-CENTER exhibition space (3/30 building 1, Komsomolskaya Square). Twenty-nine Russian galleries will participate in the event. A special preview will be held for collectors and representatives of the art community on December 3 and 4. The project is supported by MR, Yandex Pay, The Act, Konstantin Chaykin, Yandex Afisha, Beluga, and edis.

"I'm thrilled that Moscow finally has a dedicated graphic art fair, because I personally see both diversity and professionalism in this field. While other media are widely and interestingly represented in Moscow's art scene, graphics seem to be overshadowed. In this context, the Overton fair will fill the gap and, crucially, provide impetus for the further development of this exciting field of contemporary art", says Elena Selina, curator, co-founder of XL Gallery, and member of the Cosmoscow Expert Committee.

The Oberton Fair will be held at the **TON-CENTER**, a new multifunctional venue housed in a historic building designed by architect Konstantin Ton in the 1840s. It previously housed the circular train depot of the Leningradsky (Nikolaevsky) Railway Station on Komsomolskaya Square.

The fair will feature works from 29 galleries from Moscow, St. Petersburg, Nizhny Novgorod, Voronezh, and Vladivostok, as well as a special New Year's project from Pogodina Gallery.

The fair will bring together works by leading contemporary artists under the roof of a historic building. Fairgoers will be able to see works by Olga Chernysheva at the Iragui Gallery stand; PiranesiLAB will present graphic works by Vitaly Pushnitsky; Syntax Gallery will display works by Valery Chtak; the Kovcheg Gallery stand will feature works by Garif Basyrov; Anna Nova Gallery will present works by Alexandra Gart, and more.

The participating galleries were invited by the Oberton organizers. The key selection criteria were the content and quality of projects implemented throughout the year, as well as experience participating in international and Russian contemporary art fairs. This format allows for a meaningful dialogue between projects from different galleries and ensures the high quality of the entire program.

A special project by **Pogodina Gallery** will introduce viewers to a unique genre of intimate postcard-like works created by artists as gifts for loved ones. It will bring together leading contemporary artists from different generations, offering a unique cross-section of the contemporary art scene. Participants include Aidan Salakhova, Konstantin Zvezdochetov, Pavel Pepperstein, Alexander Brodsky, Leonid Tishkov, and others.

The online platform TEO by Cosmoscow will present a collaboration with New Urban Artists at the fair. This charity project was created in St. Petersburg with the curatorial support of street artists Stas Bags and Evgenia Shtil. The initiative aims to support the professional development of unique artists with disabilities. The stand will feature works by Zoyka, Vitalik Chistyakov, Lyuba Obraztsova, Yura Snegir, Ilya Minin, Tanya Vlasova, and Kostya Laptev.

Professional art consultants will be on hand at the Oberton fair. They will provide you with expert help to navigate the diverse selection of works, introduce galleries, key names, and trends, and help you select art specifically for your collection. A private tour lasts 45 to 60 minutes and is designed for one guest, with the possibility of inviting one more. The price for a Private Art Tour ticket is 5,000 rubles (6,500 rubles during Collector's Hour).

Press accreditation and ticket sales will open on November 25 on the official website.
